



The Course of Current Events August 2006

In every conflict there are two sides pitted against one another. Each side has its strengths and each has its weaknesses. History has documented that the greatest asset any one side of a conflict can have is its spirit of tenacity and determination to win.

The side with the greater determination can stand out and win even against a stronger and larger force. This was the case, for example, of the Viet Cong guerillas in Vietnam. Viet Cong determination proved greater than the American resolve to fight and win. The Viet Cong were more determined to win than the Americans were willing to die. History has documented that America withdrew from Viet Nam and the country fell to communism to this day.

During WWII Japanese fighters faced with overwhelming superior Allied forces still fought to the last man racking up shocking casualties in their American enemies. In the end, however, they lost for one reason, their opponents; the Allies were just as tenacious and determined to win. There was no fear of massive causality counts. The resolve to win was greater than the fear of death. Therefore, the Americans won in battle after battle. In spite of massive casualties, they pressed forward until victory. When one is convinced of one's cause, then whatever the price one must pay, one pursues one's fight regardless of all losses.

The Allies won because they understood this definition of determination. Indeed, it was an understanding of this determination that led to the American decision to drop the Atomic Bomb on Japan with the hope of ending WWII. The Allies understood well that a land invasion of Japan would lead to the deaths of literally millions, both Allies and Japanese, who would fight to the last man. Therefore, rather than wastefully sacrifice Allied soldiers, the Bomb was dropped. Less people in the end were killed, and the determination of the Japanese was broken. In the end those Japanese determined to continue the fight, for the most part, committed suicide (hara kiri), the rest succumbed to the greater determination.



The old saying holds true here. Those who do not learn from the mistakes of history are destined to repeat them.

Israel's present conflict with radical Islam is a lop-sided failure. Due to the lack of significant Israeli and worldwide Jewish resolve, the radical Islamic movement will naturally be in the end victorious.

World public opinion cries out in outrage when Arab children are killed by Israel and at the same time yawn and care much less when countless Jewish children are similarly killed. The world now demands an Israeli cease-fire. Was there such a call for the dismantling of terror groups in Lebanon and elsewhere every time an Israeli school was targeted and children murdered by terrorists?

Muslim children go to school everyday and are taught Nazi propoganda to hate Jews, how Jews are sub-human and need to be killed. No Jewish child has ever been taught anywhere at any time in history to hate or kill Muslims or any other people. Yet, these self same Arab children grow up to be the suicide bombers and terrorists who kill Jewish children. In a recent poll 87% of Lebanese citizens expressed support for Hez'b'alah. That means 87% of Lebanon supports the destruction of Israel and the murder of all its citizens. What then should Israel do? What would any normal country do?

No one likes war. No one wants to see innocents suffer. Yet, the world apparently has a double standard. The world pays lip service to Israeli suffering. Token mention is always made about the thousands of rockets fired into Israel. Yet, the media does not seem to cover the suffering of the Israeli families. The reason for this apparent one-sidedness in media coverage and world public opinion is obvious and clearly indicative of the not so latent anti-Semitism growing worldwide at an epidemic proportion.

The world always views the Jews, ah, I mean, Israel as the aggressor. Although there are terrorists, be they in Lebanon, Gaza, or the rest of so-called Palestine, the human suffering that they create is not actually their fault. A growing number of people around the world are convinced that Israel, by mere presence of its existence is to blame for all the turmoil in the Middle East. Israel is always to blame, Israel is always at fault. It is that plain and simple. The State of Israel needs to be stopped, the world cries, and already legitimate voices are being heard that the State of Israel needs to be "peacefully" dismantled.

Think about how the United States would respond if a Hispanic movement arose calling for the dismantling of the southern United States and its reconstitution into



a separate and new Hispanic nation called Atzlan. How would the United States government respond to this group if and when they turned to terrorism to achieve their goals? Indeed, there already is such a movement growing in strength in the south-west United States. It should come as no surprise that this movement has publicly claimed support for the enemies of the United States and has embraced Nazi-like anti-Semitism. The American government response to such a threat is far different than the response it demands from Israel facing a similar threat.

Bottom line, the Jewish State and the Jewish people are of weak resolve. The State of Israel cares more about placating international public opinion than the future security of the Jewish people. The international Jewish community only wants to be left alone and not bothered with the political and religious consequences of being a separate nation, subject as we are to the oldest and most entrenched prejudice and hatred known to man, anti-Semitism.

Run, as they will, assimilate all they want, one lesson Adolph Hitler taught the Jews was, you can run and you can hide, but you will not get away. Even those who had only one Jewish grandparent, but were otherwise entirely Gentile Christians were still considered Jewish enough to be murdered in the camps. Only a fool believes Nazism has died. It is alive and stronger today than ever before in history. Like it or not, the forces of evil are in the middle of their plans to bring about the Final Solution, Part 2. They have no intention of letting even the most assimilated of Jews get away.

With regards to the present conflict, Israel will fight for a while, making a good show, and then slack off into weakness all the while trying to disguise this weakness under the false guise of a pursuit for peace. Present withdrawals in Lebanon are being called victories, when those in the know in the military recognize defeat when they see it.

The pursuit of peace will not work under these circumstances any more than it would have helped in Viet Nam or at Iwo Jima. The desire and pursuit of peace did not stop the attack on Pearl Harbor, it could not have prevented 9/11 and it will not help Israel here either. Simply put, unless Israel becomes willing to stand up against international anti-Semitism and political opposition and fight a massive war, with possible massive casualties to defeat the hate filled enemy, then the self same hate filled enemy will grow in power and military strength until such a time when it will win its victory over the State of Israel and the Jewish people worldwide.
