On the contrary, look for meaning in the simplest and most subtle of things. The other side operates through the subtle, therefore, that is the language it speaks, and the language it teaches.

Anything that is "over-the-top" is not to be trusted, and is immediately suspect of being false and seductive. Watch out for what you want! Watch out for what you truly desire! Chances are, what you first experience will be nothing but a test to ascertain if you can be easily seduced! If you are, then your path will be skewered for lifetimes to come. Be cautious! Do not accept what you want. If it comes too easily and too quickly, you can rest assured that it is false.

Refinement of both body and mind is necessary in order to enable clarity of consciousness, and the expansion of awareness into the other realms. One whose body and/or mind is congested, and sick with all kinds of enslaving attachments will never be able to go anywhere. I have long warned my students that unless they are able to achieve equanimity, the chances of them going anywhere are slim at best.
