

Occult Mechanics

The human species is a composite organism. We are made up of many parts, not all of which are indigenous to our Earth. Our minds, both individually and collectively originate from another dimension where life is very different from how we know it here.

The human mind, or as others call it, the soul (Neshama), is not an organic physical component of our bodies, therefore it is not subject to physical law or what we call the natural order. Of course there is an order, a rule of law that operates in the realm of mind, yet that dimension follows its own rules.

Although the dimension of mind is foreign to our physical space, it is not foreign to our humanity, because we spend a good deal of our time in that alternate dimension. Every time we close our eyes to imagine, sleep and dream, we enter into a realm of thought that can take us to alternate, but actual places in space and time. Our imagination can become so real that it can overcome our physical circumstances.

This is how mind-control and hypnosis functions. One can train the mind to believe that one is relaxing on a warm sunny beach somewhere in the South Pacific and totally lose awareness of the fact that one is instead in the dentist's office undergoing root canal work. The power of the mind is so strong that through one's imagination one can totally negate the awareness of one's actual physical surroundings along with any stimulations being produced on the body there.

Once in such a state, one's imagination can become so real that in essence one's reality becomes that new place. Under such circumstances, life here on Earth ceases. In such a case, we find the dead body of the individual, with the death being attributed to either a heart attack or unknown causes. The Talmud discusses a number of these incidents and we have also seen them in



modern times. Do not underestimate the power of the human mind to control both life and death.

The power of the mind is strong from both ends, both from the conscious side working in and the unconscious side working out. However, the two opposites work in different directions and speak entirely different languages. One who learns the operational language of the unconscious can, in essence, program oneself with powerful mental messages that can be activated and enacted with a simple mental image.

The unconscious mind does not operate within the context of rational verbal communication. The unconscious mind thinks and communicates in accordance to its original manner outside of our space/time continuum. The unconscious speaks to our conscious selves in the same language that infants use to communicate with the outside world prior to their developing the ability to communicate rationally and verbally. The inner mind communicates with our conscious selves with a series of archetypal images instead of with words. Our unconscious minds project imagery into the conscious mind, yet it uses a highly individualized set of pictorial images that can only be understood by the individual. This is the foundation of our human enjoyment of art.

Biblical prophecy was an art form. All Torah discussions about prophecy state clearly that no two prophets ever saw the same spiritual reality. This is because spiritual reality is not something that can be visually seen. It does not exist within our space/time continuum. It has no physical form as we understand them. Therefore, in order for our minds to grasp a form of formless reality we have to use an intermediary gap to bridge the difference between the two faculties of mind. As we say, both beauty and ugliness reside in the eye of the beholder.

We can easily tap into our unconscious reservoir of mental strength by approaching the unconscious mind in the language it speaks; this is the language of symbols and imagery. Therefore, the symbol is powerful and in a moment speaks a thousand words. Yet, in order for a symbol to be potent, it must be understood and the simpler the better. The unconscious mind does not need, desire or appreciate academic complications. Simplicity is always best. Many forms of art, however detailed and complicated still manage to project an impression, one that if felt deep in the heart. Yet, however, deep each impression is felt, upon examination, each feeling and interpretation will be found to be unique to each individual.

Imagery content is not understood by the unconscious mind with academic recognition. It is understood intuitively and actually felt emotionally. This is why there is a big connection between intuition and emotion. One leads to the other, often, but not always bypassing the rational cognitive intellect. The symbol speaks to the heart, the deepest place within the mind, where

knowledge and passion meet. It is therefore vital that the symbols one chooses to embrace present something deep and dear to one's heart.

This also explains the highly subjective nature of visions. Have you ever noticed that anyone who has experienced any type of a vision always sees an image or an entity based upon their own cultural beliefs and pursuits? An individual from one religion never has a vision of an entity or icon from another. No Protestant has a vision of the Virgin Mary. No Jew has a vision of Mohammed. No Hindu has a vision of Eliyahu HaNavi. Each individual sees what their culture, religion and faith have trained them to see. This is even true of atheists. They see modern visions of extraterrestrials, whereas in ancient times, religious individuals had visions of demons.

We are left to ponder the question, what is going on here? Are there numerous "Heavens" each with their own set of gods, angels and demons, or is there only a single "Heavenly" reality and we all perceive it differently, each of us in accordance to our own preset mental constructs? Needless to say, the second answer is the correct one.

The unconscious mind of the individual presents to the conscious mind the non-physical reality of the dimension in which it interacts through the only medium that can comprehend it. This is through the academic intellectual and the subjective images of the individual conscious mind. The alternate reality is objective and real unto itself. However, due to its absolute different nature, the conscious mind knowing only construct physical reality can only perceive it in its own specific unique individual way. Therefore, no two prophets ever see the same spiritual vision.

This is clear from the Bible when one compares the visions of Isaiah to Ezekiel. This is all the more so true when one compares the visions of an individual from one culture to someone from another. They are not envisioning competitive realities in Heaven. They are seeing the same things, each within their own context. AND IT IS THE INDIVIDUAL HUMAN MIND THAT MISUNDERSTANDS THIS AND CREATES THE DIVISIONS THAT DIVIDE US AND HARM US.

True spiritual visionaries, from all walks of life, from every culture and religion, transcend their apparent differences, recognize the subjective nature of what they are seeing and delve into its essence, perceiving the true message, regardless of how it is culturally packaged. This is how the evil sorcerer, Bilaam was able to have a clear and true prophecy from G-d.

This is the secret of overcoming all occult forces and evil influences. All the perceived imageries of devils and demons, of evil and mayhem are nothing more than mental constructs projected onto an individual hypnosis style with the intent to trip up the individual and to get them to succumb to the images that their minds perceive. Bottom line, the occult operates by spreading

mental illness and judging by how such illness proliferates in our society today, the forces of the occult are growing by leaps and bounds.

It is clear from the Book of Daniel that even the Watcher Angels punish wanton human beings in this same way by creating the mental circumstances that lead to psychiatric illness. Angels (and other entities) attack human beings by projecting into the unconscious mind all types of frightening imagery, fears and nightmares until the mind cannot take it any longer and goes insane, not being able to tell the difference between the outside physical reality and the internal bizarre images. This is the spiritual reason underlying schizophrenia.

This is exactly how the Book of Daniel describes how the angels punished King Nebuchadnezzar. They struck his mind and he went insane. This is the same way angels operate today and the same way how occult practitioners attack their victims. Everything works through the unconscious mind and how unconscious content is perceived by the conscious rational side of the mind that deals with life in this physical world.

Protect the mind and one stays secure. There is no greater protection for the mind than the source of the mind. This, of course, is the Creator. This explains why everyone, regardless of our religious origins, that calls upon G-d the Creator always receives renewed strength, regardless of one's cultural affiliations. This too is spoken of in the Bible in a prophecy given to Malakhi. G-d looks to the heart, not to the mistakes of the intellect.

Therefore, power symbols that represent archetypal spiritual imagery that can be embraced by all and not just a few have great strength. Their unique use of colors and numbers can have a remarkable affect. I have developed one such symbol that I will introduce to you now. It has multiple meanings, the basics I can explain here, but their deeper meanings I will leave for you to contemplate.

The number 250 is special because of its Hebrew numerical significance. This number represents the LAMP of G-d. This number shines the Divine light. Yet, it does not do so merely because I say so. Rather, it is the LAMP because G-d is in it in a unique way. Let me explain.

We human beings are generally constructed of three basic parts. We have our minds, our hearts and our bodies. Each of these three areas operates in their own spheres of influence. Each of these therefore needs to become subservient to Heaven. How does one subserviate one's mind, one's heart and one's body to Heaven? The answer is by allowing the Source that rises up from within the unconscious mind to pour into the conscious mind and to influence each of our three parts. Remember, it is the unconscious mind that controls all three elements within us. Therefore, it is through the unconscious mind that they can be influenced.

The source of the unconscious mind is G-d. G-d's revealed holy Name in Torah is YKVK. Some call this Jehovah, others Yahweh. Neither of these pronunciations is accurate and no pronunciation of the Name is necessary. The power of the Name stands for itself. So powerful is the Name of G-d that the concept alone has tremendous power even without its form in the original Hebrew. G-d's Name is an art form.

The Name of G-d emanates from the realm of the unconscious. As such it is above intellect. Therefore, it is not subject to rational analysis and intellectual diagnosis. The holy Name therefore has no one pronunciation, for all pronunciations are included within it. The Name YKVK is the Power. It alone stands against all forces and it alone can conquer all foes. Therefore, when combined with other similar forces, we only strengthen the manifestation of its already limitless power.

There are other names of G-d used throughout the Torah. Each of these Names has specific meanings and subjective applications. Certain Names are attributed to certain human functions and emanate and dominate these functions.

The holy Name Ehyeh, "I am what I am" spoken by G-d to Moses at the burning bush correlates to the realm of mind. The holy Name Elohim, "G-d," used in Genesis, when G-d created the Heavens and the Earth, correlates to the heart. The holy Name Adonai, "my L-rd" used often by the prophets to refer to "my L-rd YKVK" correlates to the body.

We have three holy Names of G-d, Ehyeh, Elohim and Adonai; one each corresponding to head, heart and body. Each of these Names has their source in YKVK. Each of these Names receives their sustenance and support from YKVK. When YKVK is united with each of these Names, it imbues these Names with power and thereby fills the corresponding parts within us with the Divine power.

Unite YKVK with Ehyeh to strengthen the mind. Unite YKVK with Elohim to strengthen the heart. Unite YKVK with Adonai to strengthen the body. This process of strengthening is performed by a simple mental exercise of visualizing the Names and by joining them together. Remember, the unconscious mind is influenced by imagery. When we create a holy imagery within our minds, this creates an actual reality in the unconscious. That unconscious reality then comes back into us, in this case giving us instant intuitive power for our minds, hearts and bodies.

If one were to look at these holy Names numerically, we will find that in Hebrew gematria the Name Ehyeh equals 21, the name Elohim equals 86 and the Name Adonai equals 65. Now, we add YKVK which is equal to 26. Yet, we

do not add the Name YKVK just once. No, we must unite it with all three Names. Therefore, we unite YKVK 26 with Ehyeh 21; we unite YKVK 26 with Elohim 86 and we unite YKVK 26 with Adonai 65. Together then we have 26, 21, 26, 86, 26 and 65. Together all six numbers add up to 250. This then is the LAMP of G-d.

The LAMP is formed by three specific forms of union. Therefore, when we visualize the number 250 we superimpose it over three concentric and overlapping circles. Each circle represents one of the three spheres that form the LAMP, these being mind, heart and body. The colors of each are distinct and represent a merging of the YKVK element with the individual elements of each sphere. Thus all three spheres are a combination of very specific colors to express the individual unions occurring in each sphere.

When one who understands the 250 gazes upon its image, replete with all its colors and significances, one is actually at the unconscious level, calling for the active Presence of YKVK, the Creator, inviting "Him" into one's mind, one's heart and one's body. Therefore this simple number and its representative symbol becomes our tool for meditation, enabling us to call upon, merge with and be renewed by the power of Almighty G-d.

A simple number and three overlapping spheres is now a secret power symbol. It will be recognized by the unconscious mind as representing all the material I have just described. Regardless of what the conscious mind remembers or understands about it, the unconscious mind "has got the picture." It understands the image. Therefore, from now on, one wishing to gaze upon it, or wear it as a lapel pin (which we produce, and of course, copyright) can be enriched by its presence and well as recognize others who share the same beliefs and knowledge.

No one else will know what you know, no one else will understand. You will have an advantage to cultivate a strength, focus and power that they will not be able to comprehend. This is how sacred symbols operate. You are now empowered to speak the language of the angels, using the same form of communication as they do.

This is also the secret of the prophetic arts, the occultic arts, the martial arts and all art in general. It flows from within you and has a life and energy all its own. Every artist will understand exactly what I am saying. Every non-artist will continue to be baffled. Just remember this; Nicola Tesla and Albert Einstein were artists in the same way as were Rembrandt and DaVinci; in the same way as Sun Tzu and the Shaolin and in the same way as Isaiah, Ezekiel, Rabbi Shimon Bar Yohai, the Ari'zal and the Ba'al Shem Tov. All these men, from divergent walks of life, all used their minds in similar fashion, as I have described herein. I have revealed much here and concealed even more. The artist reader will be able to extract what I am saying from what I am not.
