

A Slave's Obligations

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What are the obligations of a slave? Is a slave required by law to obey his/her master? By whose law is such a determination made, by man's law or by G-d's law? Is a human being allowed to violate the laws of his fellow men if and when those man-made laws violate the inalienable laws of G-d? Maybe it is better to ask, is it not obligatory for men to violate those laws made by his fellow men that violate the laws of G-d?

I know, I am asking a lot of questions, but these questions and their answers very much control your lives, your welfare and your future. If you do not ask the right questions and also discover the right answers, everything you will be left with will be wrong. Instead of being free, you will become a slave, if you are not one already.



When we think of slavery we imagine some long-gone past when an individual was nothing more than property, belonging to a master, with no rights or privileges whatsoever. Now, in our modern western secular world we imagine ourselves so much better. But think about, how much better are we really? Just how free are we? Let's look at the facts.

Are we free to believe what we want? Maybe. But are we free to express our beliefs and to practice them? Definitely not! Ask American Christians who wish to express their faith in G-d and appreciation of American tradition by erecting a manger scene for their Christmas holiday in their small town public squares. There is always a vocal miniscule minority that expresses objection and thus the views of the vast majority are repressed.

This is just one of many examples of outright religious persecution occurring here in the United States against Christians and others of Biblical faith (including Orthodox Jews) under the false guise of the so-called separation of Church and State. This is a policy claimed by government to be enshrined in the American Constitution (specially the First Amendment). Yet, anyone who has ever read the First Amendment sees clearly that there is no such principle.

Government by law was not supposed to endorse one religion over another. Government was never charged to remove religion from the public forum as it is now happening today. Here in modern America, peoples of all traditional religions are by no means free to practice their religions and their beliefs. And the anti-religious vocal secular minority rejoice as they lead yell their war-cry against everything moral and right.

Is there freedom and safety even in one's own home? Ask the Jewish Israelis who lived in Gaza (and before them in the Sinai) when their government sent in armed troops to throw them out from their homes and to turn over their land to the enemies of the state. Although performed in the name of peace, it was known then and proven now that no peace was ever accomplished. It was

all a lie. The government of Israel clearly acted against the interests of its own citizens robbing them of their livelihoods and their own homes. There is no greater definition of betrayal than this.

Bible believing, G-d fearing patriotic Americans and Bible believing, G-d fearing, patriotic Israelis share one thing in common, their respective governments have betrayed their founding principles and have morphed into monsters the likes of which have only been known in science fiction and in the worst nightmares.

Traditional moral Americans cannot by law express many of their Bible-based views. If they speak out against the immorality of abortion or homosexuality, they are immediately condemned in the public media and called all kinds of defamatory names. Indeed, in some cases they can be subject to legal prosecution.

This was very much the case centuries ago in ancient Israel when the Greeks ruled the land and made every effort to force the Jews to give up their Torah-based religion. Eventually this led to the Maccabee revolt (the story of Hanuka). For the short term, respite was achieved, but then even the Maccabees corrupted themselves and left the Holy Land in a quagmire that eventually led to the Roman War and the destruction of Jerusalem, the Holy Temple and the exile of the Jewish people for two-thousand years. Corruption always bring destruction in its stead.

Long ago wise King Solomon said, there is nothing new under the sun. Repression is repression no matter what name it goes by and no matter how it is cloaked or disguised as freedom, enlightenment or progress. In the end, anything that strips a man of his inalienable rights as ordained by our blessed Creator is nothing other than a devious plot by the forces of evil that seek to enslave the human soul.

In Biblical times, Abraham stood up to the evil dictator Nimrod, Moses stood up against Pharaoh and the Maccabees stood up against the Greeks. In modern times, the American founding fathers inspired by these Biblical examples stood up against the repression of European England. And here we are again today, with now emancipated American again being tread upon by the crushing heel of European socialism and snobbery.

Again, the Jewish people and the State of Israel are subject to European antisemitism and its new found home in extremist Islam. Yet, unlike Biblical times, we do not have a Abraham, a Moses, a Judah Maccabee or a George Washington. Without moral guidance and proper leadership, people are left to their own devices to fight for their own freedoms and to face the ruthless wrath of an oppressive government that cares nothing for them or for their individual rights.

We cannot fight the system and if you ask the majority of people, most have already been seduced into accepting the so-called rights to act immorally and irresponsibly against the natural order. As it has been said, if you can't beat them, join them. So many, instead of acknowledging themselves to be slaves, have chosen to deceive themselves into believing that they are masters. There is nothing sadder than to see a slave who deludes himself into thinking he is free.

Evil-doers have long asked, how does one become free from submission to G-d's Will? They finally discovered the answer. They simply declare that there is no real G-d, that all religion is nonsense

and that individuals should be “free” to act however they wish. Some call this freedom, but the rational and coherent know it by its true name, anarchy. Anarchy is the law of the jungle, where “dog eats dog.” This is not natural for man to live this way. G-d created us to live in a Garden, it is we who have chosen to abandon the Garden and instead have moved to the savagery of the jungle.

In the Garden, we have cultivated, disciplined growth and beauty. In the jungle we have no law, no order, and everyone acts selfishly for themselves. The only way to have order in the jungle is by ruthless repression. The only way to bring order to the jungle is to turn it into a zoo. When governments create zoos for their populations instead of gardens, we have the worst expressions of human depravity. This has happened so many times in the past and it is happening again right now around us, everywhere.

Gardens embrace the goodness of G-d inherent in nature. Jungles embrace the chaos and evil that G-d commanded man to avoid. G-d endowed man with inalienable natural rights and taught us the difference between right and wrong, between moral and immoral and between what is natural and unnatural so that we could “safeguard the Garden and tend it its needs.” Yet, when evil men prevail, they seek to remove us from G-d's Garden and place us into their zoos to control us, to suck out our wealth, livelihoods and eventually our lives.

Who gave government the right to control people acting naturally and morally? Who gave government the right to tell people how they may publicly express or not express their sacred religious beliefs? Who gave government the right to throw people out of their homes? Who gave government control over the private affairs of anyone? And here in America, we should ask, who gave government the right to dictate to its citizens that they have an obligation under penalty of law to purchase health-care insurance and to pay for that which they may not need or desire to have?

Only a government that is out of control considers its authority supreme. Only a repressive regime acts deceptively to confuse the public and under the guise of acting for the common good enact laws that curtail natural inalienable rights of individuals and then produce information campaigns to lie to the people persuading them to surrender their rights and freedoms for some assumed greater good. This too is nothing new under the sun.

Long ago in Biblical times, when faced with a prosperous Israel, ancient Pharaoh spoke and said, “let us deal shrewdly with them.” And indeed, our modern Pharaohs follow in the footsteps of their Biblical predecessor acting shrewdly today to deceive good, moral minded, G-d fearing, Bible believing individuals to entrap them in all forms of modern day slavery. Indeed, so many today are slaves who do not know it, will not accept it even if told, and for the most part do not care either way. With the advent of such apathy, the concentration camps and slaughter houses cannot be too far behind.

Free men naturally stand up to oppression. They reject the laws that other immoral men make that contradict the laws of G-d. They face the consequences of their outspoken opposition boldly and face the atrocities imposed upon them by godless (secular) evil (socialist) dictators and their minions. Eventually enough public outrage will grow and a popular uprising will naturally swell until it explodes into rebellion against the repressive authority and the moral and G-d fearing will fight to take back those rights which are the due of all men.

Both the American and Israeli political systems can be changed, removing from both of these natural allies, the internal forces in government and society that act against the interests of sound government and against a safe, balanced and normal society. The respective peoples must learn to stand together as patriots for freedom, justice and the Biblical way (what was once the American way) and restore honor to government and to society at large.

Part of our inalienable rights as endowed upon us by our Creator is the right to rebel against tyranny. More than a right; it is an obligation. We are required by Divine writ to establish right, proper and moral societies governed by right and proper natural laws.
